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About Measures for Justice

Measures for Justice (MFJ) was founded in 2011 to develop a data-driven performance measurement system to assess and compare the criminal justice process from arrest to post-conviction on a county-by-county basis. The system comprises a set of performance measures, not all of which can be populated for every state. The measures address three broad goals:

- Enhance Public Safety
- Promote a Fair Process
- Improve Fiscal Responsibility

MFJ's mission is to use data to transform how we measure, understand, and enhance the criminal justice system in America. To this end, MFJ has developed a web-based Data Portal that convenes all the measures and analyses and offers them free to the public. The Portal is searchable and can be configured to break down performance data across multiple factors including defendant and victim race/ethnicity, sex; indigent status, and age; defendant-victim relationship; offense type; offense severity; drug type; whether the case involved domestic abuse; and attorney type. The platform also allows for county-to-county comparison within and across states.

The Portal is designed for any user – from criminal justice stakeholders to regular people interested in how their county is performing – and, in this way, offers up a nonpartisan language that reform initiatives can deploy. MFJ's goal is to ensure the platform becomes the go-to-resource for practitioners, legislators, and advocates – for anyone in a position to initiate and catalyze criminal justice reform.

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Methodology

The development of the Measures for Justice is an iterative process that involves six general steps: (1) conceptual development; (2) data collection and storage; (3) data management; (4) data quality control; (5) measure calculation; and (6) measure visualization. We seek input from stakeholders at every stage of the process, which sometimes leads to changes in how the measures are calculated. This document represents the most recent version of our methodology at the time of publication.

1. Conceptual Development

The conceptual development of the Measures for Justice has been a rigorous and iterative process. Developing a measurement system that can be applied nationwide began with identifying the right performance measures. The right measures need to be relevant. They must count what matters. This means they must be aligned with agreed-upon factors of success. For example, the connection between well-known health indicators (such as blood pressure, cholesterol, and blood glucose) and our health and well-being are well established and self-evident to most people. They allow us to monitor our own health and change our behavior to enhance it. In the criminal justice sector, however, normative agreement on what success means in different domains is still evolving.

To establish the domains from which data would be drawn, in June of 2011 Measures for Justice convened a panel of criminal justice practitioners, researchers, and experts in the development of performance measurement systems. The Data Council ([see Appendix A](#)), as it was known, looked at published standards and practices to understand how criminal justice leaders, advocates, and professional associations conceptualize high performance. The panel agreed that a criminal justice system functioning at the highest level should accomplish the following:

1. Promote a fair process to ensure the system preserves individual liberties by affording people due process, and by delivering basic legal services equally across demographics.
2. Be cost efficient so that local and state governments can exercise fiscal responsibility.
3. Improve public safety so that people feel safe and protected at home, in public places, and in correctional facilities.
4. Improve public trust in the criminal justice system so that decisions are generally accepted and people who have contact with it want to participate in its administration (e.g., reporting crimes to the police, cooperating with criminal investigations).
5. Ensure defendants and victims have access to justice.
6. Ensure the system works in a timely fashion.
7. Ensure the system is transparent and promotes accountability on every level.
8. Ensure that law enforcement, prosecutors, judges, and defense attorneys act in accordance with basic notions of due process and equal protection.
9. Ensure independence and accountability by enforcing the separation of powers inherent to the adversarial system.

The panel then determined that these nine objectives, in turn, contribute to three overarching goals of the criminal justice system: Public Safety, Fair Process, and Fiscal Responsibility. With these objectives and goals in mind, the Data Council proposed a set of 50 aspirational performance measures. In 2012 MFJ attempted to populate these measures using data collected by the Bureau of Justice Statistics, but found that only a few of them could be created with their datasets, that data were generally available only for the 50 to 75 largest counties, and that some of the most recent data were still several years old. However, this exercise served as proof of concept to demonstrate a void in our knowledge and measurement of local criminal justice systems.

In 2013 MFJ embarked on a pilot project to populate the measures using court data from Wisconsin, a state known for the high quality and comprehensiveness of data in its court case management system. While working with Wisconsin's court data, MFJ realized that few of the aspirational measures could be populated using administrative information extracted from existing case management systems. At this point, MFJ had two options: (1) conduct original data collection with a sample of counties, or (2) revise the measures so that they could be populated with the administrative data that were currently available. MFJ chose the second option for three strategic reasons: (1) original data collection is very costly and would have required the use of sampling techniques; (2) using a sample of counties would have been contrary to MFJ's mission to measure local criminal justice everywhere in the United States; and (3) original data collection is often more burdensome on criminal justice agencies than extracting already existing data from their case management systems.

MFJ researchers conducted a series of analyses of Wisconsin court data and came up with a list of 75 preliminary measures that could conceivably be created using Wisconsin's administrative datasets. MFJ spent most of 2014 and 2015 workshopping these measures with different groups, including practitioners, researchers, academics, activists, journalists, and other stakeholders. In 2015 MFJ convened a second advisory group of criminologists, the Methods and Measurement Council (MMC) ([see Appendix A](#)), which is responsible for vetting our Measures and methodology. And, in early 2016 MFJ convened a third advisory group, the Benchmarking Council (BC) ([see Appendix A](#)), comprising senior criminologists with decades of experience in researching all areas of criminal justice. The Councils met several times to discuss and vet the final list of Measures.

After integrating feedback from stakeholders and our advisory groups, we launched our public Data Portal¹ in May 2017. The list of Measures has continued to evolve since then as we work with data from more jurisdictions and receive feedback from more stakeholders. To be prioritized for publication, each Measure needs to: (1) have a clear definition; (2) integrate prior research on criminal justice processes; (3) have an unambiguous interpretation; (4) control for confounding factors; (5) not be duplicative; and (6) be relevant to and actionable for potential users.

The initial process took six years, but our measure development will continue for years to come.

2. Data Collection and Storage

One of the largest obstacles to creating an integrated and comprehensive criminal justice measurement system is the lack of uniformity in how local jurisdictions collect, record, and maintain data. Since MFJ launched its Data Portal in 2017, Florida², California³, and Connecticut⁴ have passed laws to mandate local criminal justice agencies to collect and report more uniform data. Though other states are attempting to follow suit, the challenge remains for most of the country. To overcome this obstacle, MFJ's Data Outreach team approaches each jurisdiction individually, meets with state and local stakeholders at different stages of the process, and collects institutional knowledge along with data in order to help standardize measurement across jurisdictions.

MFJ conducts data collection one state at a time. Once a state is selected, the first step is to evaluate centralized data resources. This systematic evaluation examines whether statewide datasets exist, what information is captured in these datasets, and whether that information can be extracted in bulk or must be compiled on a case-by-case basis. MFJ's first and primary sources for data typically come in the form of bulk data extractions from the statewide court data repository and the Department of Corrections (DOC). This usually involves submitting a formal data request that follows the protocol required by the state court administrator and the DOC.

When no statewide datasets are available or when the statewide court data are insufficient, the MFJ team attempts to collect data at the county level from prosecutor offices and jail administrators. MFJ emails and calls relevant agencies to schedule in-person meetings; during these meetings MFJ's outreach representatives present the goals of the project to local stakeholders who then provide valuable information about their data infrastructure including how they collect, code, and maintain their data. MFJ's Data Outreach Team also asks local stakeholders about their offices' specific practices and policies. When in-person meetings are not possible, the team works with jurisdictions to collect their data remotely. Providing data to MFJ is, of course, voluntary and not all jurisdictions agree to participate in the project. This means that states will have gaps in certain areas, depending on whether individual counties agreed to provide data to populate the Measures.

MFJ obtains data through the public records request protocols established by each agency. We only file Freedom of Information Act requests when the agency specifically asks we do so to expedite the process. To avoid overburdening agencies, the Data Outreach Team tailors these requests to each office by taking into account their personnel and technology capabilities. For a complete list of the data elements we request from each agency [see Appendix B](#).

Most criminal justice agencies have an electronic case management system into which they input data. MFJ requests data in electronic formats that are machine-readable such as spreadsheets, databases, and PDFs that can be scraped using Optical Character Recognition (OCR) technology. We cannot process handwritten records or PDFs that cannot be read using OCR software. MFJ also requests that agencies deliver a codebook or data dictionary together with the data. Data are delivered

to MFJ in secure ways including: (1) electronic transmission via Secure File Transfer Protocols (SFTP) or Transport Layer Security (TLS); and (2) physical transmission via secure postal carrier (i.e., CDs or USB thumb drives).

Upon delivery to MFJ, data files are saved in a centralized, access-controlled and encrypted storage system. A Data Quality Analyst reviews the raw data at intake to ensure that all agreed upon data elements are included in the extract, checks the distributions of each data element (checking for missingness, outliers, implausible values, and potentially wrong values due to data entry errors), and reviews the data structure and table linkages. The results of this review are then communicated to the source agency and a conversation about addressing the issues identified takes place. The data are then de-identified, where applicable, and securely transferred to assigned staff's work machines for data management.

3. Data Management

Criminal justice case management systems are record-keeping structures that collect data with the goal of tracking the processing of individual cases by the agency and not necessarily for the purpose of measurement. Nevertheless, these data are suitable for measurement provided they are handled correctly. Measures for Justice has devised a Standard Operating Procedure that standardizes the data management process across agencies and jurisdictions to create a dataset that can be used to populate the Measures. Agencies provide raw data either in a single flat table where rows represent charges, or in multiple flat tables with rows representing charges, cases, defendants, court events, sentences, etc., linked through a common identifier (usually an agency-specific case number). The goal of MFJ's data management process is to produce a single flat table for each state where rows represent cases. This involves identifying the driving characteristics of a case, as explained below ([see Section 3.3](#)). The final data files are standardized across states according to a common codebook⁵. However, because the level of comprehensiveness of the raw data varies widely across jurisdictions, not all variables in the final codebook can be created in all states. Finally, due to the cross-sectional nature of our measurement, all datasets are right-censored, meaning that there may be case events that took place after the data were collected and that are thus not captured by the Measures. The Data Portal provides information on the source of the data, the date when it was extracted from the source's case management system, and the case years included in the Measure.

3.1. Protecting Privacy

We request data including defendants' personal identifiers (i.e., names and dates of birth) or, alternately, an anonymized unique defendant identifier⁶ so that we can track the same defendant across cases within the dataset. This information allows us to do several things:

- Operationalize a "case" to mean all the charges processed within a given jurisdiction that were associated with the same defendant and that were filed in court (or referred for prosecution, in the case of declinations) on the same date ([see Section 3.2. for more information](#)).
- Estimate whether the defendant had any convictions in the three years prior to the filing of the current case ([see Section 3.3.4. for more information](#)).
- Estimate whether the defendant had any violent convictions in the three years prior to the filing of the current case ([see Section 3.3.4. for more information](#)).
- Estimate whether the defendant had any new convictions within the three years after the current case's sentence date ([see Section 3.3.4. for more information](#)).
- Link cases across datasets from different agencies (only possible if defendants' names and dates of birth are provided).

Once the above procedures have been finalized on a secure server with very limited access, we remove personal identifiers from the dataset and create a unique case number that is fully de-identified to protect the privacy of defendants. The MFJ Case Number is composed of two digits representing the state (e.g., Florida=09), three digits representing the county (e.g., Alachua County, Florida=001), four digits representing the year the case was filed in court (or the year the case was referred to the prosecutor’s office if the case was declined for prosecution) (e.g., 2009), and six digits representing the case sequence within state, county, and year (e.g., 000001). For this example, the final MFJ Case Number would be 090012009000001. Furthermore, our Data Portal presents Measures that have been aggregated to the county level and does not display results with fewer than 30 cases. Therefore, it is impossible to identify an individual or a case from the Measures published online.

3.2. Defining “Case”

MFJ collects data on adult criminal cases initiated due to an alleged violation of state laws. These cases include felonies and misdemeanors (including criminal traffic offenses), and exclude violations of federal laws, violations of county and municipal ordinances, noncriminal traffic offenses, and cases involving juveniles (except for those that are ultimately waived or transferred to adult criminal court). Criminal Justice agencies use different methods to record cases. In some jurisdictions, incidents involving multiple charges and defendants are recorded using the same case number for all charges and co-defendants. Other jurisdictions may also record multiple charges under the same case number but use different case numbers for each co-defendant. Some jurisdictions define a case as all charges filed simultaneously for the same defendant for offenses committed on the same date. The Court Statistics Project⁷ of the National Center for State Courts recommends counting multiple charges associated with the same defendant and the same incident as a single case. We would like to follow this recommendation, but not all administrative datasets we receive provide the offense dates necessary to define cases as incident-based. Instead, in order to have a standard definition across states, we define a case as all charges associated with the same defendant and filed (or referred for prosecution, in the case of declinations) on the same date as a single case. We assume that when a prosecutor files multiple charges together, even for different incidents, they intend to resolve these charges simultaneously. Since the focus of our Measures is case processing, not case clearance, we believe this approach, while not perfect, is currently the best way to standardize case definition across jurisdictions.

3.3. Criteria Used to Identify the Driving Characteristics of a Case

Cases often involve multiple charges. We follow the recommendation made by the Court Statistics Project⁸ to classify cases by the most serious charge according to the state’s offense severity classification ([see Appendix F](#)). If two or more charges share the highest severity class, we select the charge representing the most serious offense type moving down from this list: “violent,” “property,” “drug,” “DUI,” “public order,” “criminal traffic,” and “other.” If two or more charges share the highest severity class and the most serious offense type, we select the charge having the most serious offense description moving down from a list of 254 charge descriptions with “murder” at the top and “other” at the bottom of the list.

This section explains how we define the variables we use to characterize cases and develop the case-level datasets from which we calculate the Measures for each state. Subheadings refer to the corresponding variable(s) in the codebook.

3.3.1. TOP BOOKING, REFERRAL, FILING, AND CONVICTION CHARGE VARIABLES

- *Top Booking Charge, Top Referred Charge, Top Filing Charge, and Top Conviction Charge*: These variables describe the most serious charge at the booking, referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively. Charge descriptions vary widely across states based on statutory laws. To standardize charges across states, we code a charge description (or statute number when a description is not available) using an offense code system modified from the system that the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) implemented in the National Corrections Reporting Program (NCRP). MFJ’s modifications included reordering offenses to reflect their seriousness, adding clarifications to the NCRP codes to ensure coding consistency, reclassifying DUI to its own offense type, reclassifying some of the “other” and “public order” offenses, and adding new codes for offenses including human trafficking, amphetamine drug offenses, opioid drug offenses, and other prescription drug offenses. See the appendices for the full offense code crosswalk.
- *Top Booking Charge Offense, Top Referred Charge Offense, Top Filing Charge Offense, and Top Conviction Charge Offense*: These variables classify the charge descriptions into fewer categories following the general groupings proposed in the BJS offense codes document.
- *Top Booking Charge Type, Top Referred Charge Offense Type, Top Filing Charge Offense Type, and Top Conviction Charge Offense Type*: These variables condense the charge descriptions into even more parsimonious offense type categories: “violent,”⁹ “property,” “drug,” “DUI,” “public order,” “criminal traffic,” and “other.” For the full crosswalk from charge description to offense type, [see Appendix G](#).
- *Top Booking Charge Severity Original, Top Referred Charge Severity Original, Top Filing Charge Severity Original, and Top Conviction Charge Severity Original*: These variables capture the severity of the most serious charge, according to the state’s offense severity classification ([see Appendix F](#)), for which severity is known at the booking, referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively.
- *Top Booking Charge Was Felony or Misdemeanor, Top Referred Charge Was Felony or Misdemeanor, Top Filing Charge Was Felony or Misdemeanor, and Top Conviction Charge Was Felony or Misdemeanor*: These variables indicate whether the most serious charge at the booking, referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively was a felony or a misdemeanor.
- *Top Booking Charge Severity by Offense Type, Top Referred Charge Severity by Offense Type, Top Filing Charge Severity by Offense Type, and Top Conviction Charge Severity by Offense Type*: These variables indicate whether the

most serious charge at the booking, referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively was a felony or a misdemeanor and whether it was violent¹⁰ or not. This allows for a broad standardization of charge severities across states.

- *Top Conviction Charge Was Drug Possession:* This variable indicates whether the most serious conviction charge was for a drug possession-related offense.
- *Top Referred Charge Was Driving on Suspended/Revoked License, Top Filing Charge Was Driving on Suspended/Revoked License, and Top Conviction Charge Was Driving on Suspended/Revoked License:* These variables indicate whether the most serious charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively was driving on a suspended or revoked license.
- *Top Referred Charge Was DUI, Top Filing Charge Was DUI, and Top Conviction Charge Was DUI:* These variables indicate whether the most serious charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively was driving under the influence of alcohol.

3.3.2 ADDITIONAL CHARGING CHARACTERISTICS

- *Total Number of Referred Charges, Total Number of Filing Charges, and Total Number of Conviction Charges:* These variables calculate, respectively, the total number of charges referred to the prosecutor by law enforcement or a complainant, the total number of charges filed in court by the prosecutor, and the total number of charges for which the defendant was convicted. These may include infractions if they were amended to a misdemeanor or a felony at a different charging stage (e.g., a charge may be referred as an infraction, but filed and convicted as a misdemeanor).
- *Case Involved Violent Referral Charge, Case Involved Violent Filing Charge, and Case Involved Violent Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a violent charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not violent.
- *Case Involved Drug Referral Charge, Case Involved Drug Filing Charge, and Case Involved Drug Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a drug charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not drug-related.
- *Case Involved DUI Referral Charge, Case Involved DUI Filing Charge, and Case Involved DUI Conviction Charge:*¹¹ These variables indicate whether the case involved a Driving Under the Influence (DUI) charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not DUI-related.
- *Case Involved Criminal Traffic Referral Charge, Case Involved Criminal Traffic Filing Charge, and Case Involved Criminal Traffic Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a criminal traffic charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not criminal traffic.
- *Resisting Arrest Was the Only Referred Charge, Resisting Arrest Was the Only Filing Charge, and Resisting Arrest Was the Only Conviction Charge:* These variables flag cases in which resisting arrest was the only charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively.

- *Disorderly Conduct Was the Only Referred Charge, Disorderly Conduct Was the Only Filing Charge, and Disorderly Conduct Was the Only Conviction Charge:* These variables flag cases in which disorderly conduct was the only charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively.
- *Charge Status from Referral to Filing, and Charge Status from Filing to Conviction:* These variables indicate whether the class severity of the top charge at referral and filing, respectively, changed in the next charging stage. Categories include no change (same severity as prior stage), charge reduction (lower severity than prior stage), and charge increase (higher severity than prior stage).
- *Ratio of Number of Filed Charges to Number of Conviction Charges:* This variable calculates the number of charges filed in court by the prosecutor for every charge of which the defendant was found guilty (or to which the defendant pleaded guilty).
- *Any Referred Charge Drug Type, Any Filing Charge Drug Type, Any Conviction Charge Drug Type:* This variable identifies the drug type (i.e., marijuana, cocaine, heroin, amphetamine, opioid, other prescription, paraphernalia, other) and activity (i.e., possession/use and distribution)¹² associated with the case at the referral, filing, and conviction stages, even when the most serious charge is not for a drug offense. This information may be provided by the source in the charge description or as a separate data element.
- *Domestic Abuse:* This variable indicates whether the case involved domestic abuse. Domestic abuse is defined as any form of abuse (including but not limited to physical violence) involving parties in a domestic relationship as defined by law. When provided, this information often comes from data on charge modifiers.¹³
- *Domestic Violence:* This variable indicates whether the case involved domestic abuse and violent charges. Domestic violence is thus a subset of domestic abuse that focuses specifically on violent acts.
- *Sex Offense:* This variable indicates whether the case involved sex offense charges, even when the most serious charge is not a sex offense.
- *Case Involved Gun Referral Charge, Case Involved Gun Filing Charge, and Case Involved Gun Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a gun charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not a gun charge.
- *Case Involved Burglary Referral Charge, Case Involved Burglary Filing Charge, and Case Involved Burglary Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a burglary charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not a burglary charge.
- *Case Involved Hate Crime Referral Charge, Case Involved Hate Crime Filing Charge, and Case Involved Hate Crime Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a hate crime charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not a hate crime charge.

¹² Distribution includes: possession with intent to sell or distribute; manufacturing; delivery; distribution; and sale.

¹³ Charge modifiers are tags used by prosecutors to explain the circumstances under which an offense took place when they are not clearly stated in the statutory description of the charge. Domestic abuse modifiers are used when the parties involved in the offense are in a domestic relationship, as defined by law.

- *Case Involved Drug, DUI, or Traffic Referral Charge, Case Involved Drug, DUI, or Traffic Filing Charge, and Case Involved Drug, DUI, or Traffic Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a drug, DUI, or traffic charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not a drug, DUI, or traffic charge.
- *Case Involved Murder by Overdose Referral Charge, Case Involved Murder by Overdose Filing Charge, and Case Involved Murder by Overdose Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a murder by overdose charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not a murder by overdose charge.
- *Case Involved Poor Investigative Practice Referral Charge, Case Involved Poor Investigative Practice Filing Charge, and Case Involved Poor Investigative Practice Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a poor investigative practice charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not a poor investigative practice charge.
- *Case Involved Police Misconduct Referral Charge, Case Involved Police Misconduct Filing Charge, and Case Involved Police Misconduct Conviction Charge:* These variables indicate whether the case involved a police misconduct charge at the referral, filing, and conviction stages respectively, even if the top charge was not a police misconduct charge.
- *Gang Activity:* This variable indicates whether the case involved charges indicating gang activity, even when the most serious charge did not indicate gang activity.
- *Gang Violence:* This variable indicates whether the case involved charges indicating gang violence, even when the most serious charge did not indicate gang violence.
- *Non-Probationable Conviction Charge:* This variable indicates whether the case involved conviction charges that were not eligible for probation, even when the most serious charge was eligible. Note that probation ineligibility is at the statute level and does not account for prior record or other case characteristics.

3.3.3. CASE LOCATION

- *State:* Identifies the state where the case was processed.
- *Judicial District:* Identifies the state and judicial district ([see Appendix H](#)) where the case was processed.
- *County:* Identifies the state and county ([see Appendix I](#)) where the case was processed.
- *FIPS:* Identifies the Federal Information Processing Standard (FIPS) number for the county ([see Appendix I](#)) where the case was processed.
- *Court Type:* In jurisdictions with a two-tiered criminal court system, this identifies the court type in which the case was disposed.
- *Arrest City:* Identifies the city where the arrest associated with the case took place.
- *Arresting Agency:* Identifies the agency that conducted the arrest associated with the case.

3.3.4. DEFENDANT CHARACTERISTICS

- *Defendant's Age*: Represents the defendant's age at time of case initiation, which is calculated using the defendant's date of birth and the arrest or referral date. When the arrest or referral date is not available, age is calculated using the case filing date.
- *Defendant's Age Group*: Classifies the age of defendants into six categories representing ranges based on the age-curve of crime.¹⁴
- *Defendant's Race*: Represents the defendant's race and ethnicity as reported in the raw data. When ethnicity data are available, the "Hispanic" category includes "white" and "black" defendants whose ethnicity is "Hispanic," and the categories "white" and "African American" exclude "Hispanics." However, when ethnicity data are not available, which occurs frequently, the "white" and "African American" categories likely also include "Hispanics."
- *Defendant's Race Group*: Classifies the defendant's race into two categories, "white" and "person of color." The "person of color" category includes all racial/ethnic groups except for "whites." This variable is used to calculate racial disparities across the Measures. When ethnicity is not included in the raw data though, the "white" category is likely to include "Hispanics," which reduces the precision of racial disparity scores.
- *Defendant's Sex*: Represents the defendant's sex as reported in the raw data. When these data are not provided by the source, we estimate sex in two complementary ways. First, we analyze the available free text data that relates to court events to identify pronouns referring to the defendant (e.g., "The defendant waives his right to a speedy trial."). In addition, if defendant names are available in the raw data, we triangulate the sex estimation using pronouns by analyzing common male and female first names.
- *Defendant's State*: Identifies the defendant's state of residence as reported in the raw data.
- *Defendant's Zip Code*: Identifies the defendant's zip code of residence as reported in the raw data.
- *Defendant's Indigent Status*: Indicates whether the court found that the defendant met the criteria to be considered indigent and had the right to a court-appointed attorney. If these data are not explicitly provided, we assume indigence when the defendant was provided a public defender or a court-appointed private attorney.¹⁵
- *Defendant's Employment*: Indicates whether the defendant was unemployed at the time of the arrest or booking associated with the case.
- *Defendant Homeless*: Indicates whether the defendant was homeless at the time of the arrest or booking associated with the case.

¹⁵ When indigent status has to be inferred from the attorney type, we are unable to capture the indigency of defendants who have pro se representation (i.e., who self-represent).

- *Prior Convictions*: Indicates whether defendants with cases filed in court were convicted of any offense in the three years prior to the current case’s filing date. Note that this is limited to jurisdictions and prior years included in the dataset.
- *Prior Convictions for Violent Charges*: Indicates whether defendants with cases filed in court were convicted of a violent offense in the three years prior to the current case’s filing date. Note that this is limited to jurisdictions and prior years included in the dataset.
- *Reconvictions*: Indicates whether sentenced defendants had any new convictions within the three years after the current case’s sentence date. Note that this is limited to convictions in jurisdictions and subsequent years included in the dataset.

3.3.5 VICTIM CHARACTERISTICS

- *Victim’s Age*: Represents the victim’s age as reported in the raw data.
- *Victim’s Age Group*: Classifies the age of victims into six categories corresponding to defendant age groups.
- *Victim’s Race*: Represents the victim’s race and ethnicity as reported in the raw data. When ethnicity data are available, the “Hispanic” category includes “white” and “black” defendants whose ethnicity is “Hispanic,” and the categories “white” and “African American” exclude “Hispanics.” However, when ethnicity data are not available, which occurs frequently, the “white” and “African American” categories likely also include “Hispanics.”
- *Victim’s Sex*: Represents the victim’s sex as reported in the raw data.
- *Multiple Victims*: Indicates whether there were multiple victims associated with the case.
- *Child Victim*: Indicates whether there were one or multiple child victims associated with the case, including alleged intentional, endangerment or actual harm.
- *Spanish-Speaking Victims*: Indicates whether there were one or multiple victims associated with the case who were Spanish-speaking.
- *Victim-Defendant Relationship*: Indicates whether the relationship between the victim and the defendant was as an intimate partner, family member, known non-family member, stranger, or if there were multiple victims.
- *Victim/Witness Program*: Indicates whether the victim had access to a victim or witness program at the prosecutor’s office.
- *Victim/Witness Program Used*: Indicates whether the victim used a victim or witness program at the prosecutor’s office.

3.3.6 DEFENSE COUNSEL

- *Attorney Type*: Identifies whether the last attorney of record was a private attorney, a public defender, a court-appointed private attorney, other type of attorney, or if the defendant self-represented. This variable excludes attorneys involved in appeals or any other post-conviction legal proceedings.

- *Public Defender*: Indicates whether the last attorney of record was a public defender. This excludes attorneys involved in appeals or any other post-conviction legal proceedings.
- *Attorney Assigned at Initial Appearance*: Indicates whether a defense attorney was assigned at the initial appearance or arraignment.
- *No Attorney at Initial Appearance*: Indicates whether a defense attorney was assigned after the initial appearance or arraignment.
- *Attorney Withdrawal*: Indicates whether the case involved at least one attorney withdrawal. This variable excludes attorney withdrawals that took place during appeals or any other post-conviction legal proceedings.
- *Total Attorney Withdrawals*: Indicates the number of attorney withdrawals associated with the case. This variable excludes attorney withdrawals that took place during appeals or any other post-conviction legal proceedings.
- *Total Number of Attorneys*: Indicates the number of attorneys associated with the case. This variable excludes attorney withdrawals that took place during appeals or any other post-conviction legal proceedings.
- *Percentage of Days with Same Attorney*: Indicates the percentage of days during the length of the case that were handled by one attorney. This is only measured for cases with public defenders and excludes conflict cases.
- *Total Attorney-Client Meetings*: Indicates the number of attorney-client meetings associated with the case. This variable excludes meetings that took place during appeals or any other post-conviction legal proceedings.

3.3.7 PRETRIAL RELEASE

- *Pretrial Release Decision*: Represents the court's initial decision regarding whether to release the defendant pending case disposition and whether the release should be subject to monetary conditions, non monetary conditions, pretrial supervision, or electronic monitoring. This variable excludes any modifications to the original decision resulting from violations of pretrial release conditions.
- *Pretrial Release Status*: Identifies cases in which the defendant was released pending case disposition. This variable includes defendants released on recognizance or nonmonetary conditions, those who met the monetary conditions (posted bail) set by the court, those released under supervision of the court, and those released with electronic monitoring
- *Monetary Conditions Amount*: Represents the bail amount (or monetary conditions) set by the court at the beginning of the case. This variable excludes any bail amounts set later in the case as a result of violations of pretrial release conditions.
- *Monetary Conditions Were \$500 or Less*: Indicates whether the bail amount (or monetary conditions) set at the beginning of the case was \$500 or less. This variable excludes any bail amounts set later in the case as a result of violations of pretrial release conditions.
- *Bail Was Paid*: Indicates whether the court initially set bail (or a bond with monetary conditions) for the defendant and bail was paid.

- *Failure to Pay Bail:* Indicates whether the court initially set bail (or a bond with monetary conditions) for the defendant and bail was not paid.
- *Monetary Conditions Reduced:* Indicates whether the bail amount (or monetary conditions) set at the beginning of the case was reduced by the court at a later date.
- *Revocation of Nonmonetary Release:* Indicates whether defendants who had nonmonetary release (release on recognizance or nonmonetary conditions) set at the beginning of the case had their release status revoked as a result of violations of the conditions imposed by the court.
- *Revocation of Monetary Release:* Indicates whether defendants who met the monetary conditions (bail) set by the court at the beginning of the case had their release status revoked as a result of violations of other conditions imposed by the court.
- *Revocation of Release on Supervision:* Indicates whether defendants who were released under pretrial supervision at the beginning of the case had their release status revoked as a result of violations of other conditions imposed by the court.
- *Violation of Pretrial Release:* Indicates whether defendants released on nonmonetary conditions and those who met the monetary conditions set by the court had their release status revoked as a result of violations of the conditions imposed by the court.
- *Failure to Appear in Court:* Indicates whether the defendant ever failed to appear in court as the current case was being processed.
- *Total Number of Failures to Appear in Court:* Calculates the total number of times the defendant failed to appear in court as the current case was being processed.
- *Pretrial Release Conditions - No Contact:* Indicates whether the pretrial release conditions in the case included provisions against contact with the victim.
- *No Contact Order:* Indicates whether at least one protective order, temporary order of protection, or stay-away order associated with the case was filed with the court.
- *No Contact Order Violation:* Indicates whether at least one protective order, temporary order of protection, or stay-away order associated with the case was violated.

3.3.8 CASE EVENTS

- *Offense Date:* Identifies the date when the offense took place. If there are multiple offense dates associated with a case, MFJ selects the earliest date.
- *Incident Report Date:* Identifies the date when the incident associated with the case was reported. If there are multiple offense dates associated with a case, MFJ selects the earliest date.
- *Referral Date:* Identifies the date when charges were referred to the prosecutor's office. If there are multiple referral dates associated with a case, MFJ selects the earliest date.

- *Arrest Date*: Identifies the date when the defendant was arrested. If the defendant was not arrested (i.e., he/she was given an appearance ticket, summons, or citation), MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple arrest dates associated with a case, the earliest date is selected. This variable excludes arrests stemming from violations of pretrial release conditions.
- *Arrest Time*: Identifies the time of day when the defendant was arrested. If the defendant was not arrested (i.e., he/she was given an appearance ticket, summons, or citation), MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple arrest dates associated with a case, the time associated with the earliest date is selected. This variable excludes arrests stemming from violations of pretrial release conditions.
- *Citation Date*: Identifies the date when the defendant was given an appearance ticket, summons, or citation. If the defendant was arrested, MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple citation dates associated with a case, the earliest date is selected.
- *Citation Time*: Identifies the time of day when the defendant was given an appearance ticket, summons, or citation. If the defendant was arrested, MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple citation dates associated with a case, the earliest date is selected.
- *Booking Date*: Identifies the date when the defendant was booked. If the defendant was not booked, MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple booking dates associated with a case, the earliest date is selected.
- *Booking Time*: Identifies the time of day when the defendant was booked. If the defendant was not booked, MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple booking dates associated with a case, the earliest date is selected.
- *Jail Release Date*: Identifies the date when the defendant was released from jail. If the defendant was not released from jail, MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple release dates associated with a case, the earliest date is selected.
- *Jail Release Time*: Identifies the time of day when the defendant was released from jail. If the defendant was not released from jail, MFJ leaves the cell blank. If there are multiple release dates associated with a case, the earliest date is selected.
- *Prosecutor Final Decision Date*: Identifies the date for the prosecutor's final decision about whether to prosecute the case.
- *Case Filing Date*: Identifies the date when charges were filed in court by the prosecutor's office.
- *Attorney Assignment Date*: Identifies the date when a permanent defense attorney was assigned to the case. If there are multiple attorney assignment dates associated with a case, MFJ selects the earliest date.
- *Attorney Withdrawal Date*: If defense counsel withdraws from the case, this field identifies the date when the withdrawal was filed in court. MFJ leaves the cell blank when there are no attorney withdrawals. If more than one attorney withdrawal is associated with the case, MFJ selects the earliest date.
- *Attorney First Meeting with Client Date*: Identifies the date when the defense attorney in the case had their first meeting with the client (defendant) in the case.
- *Initial Appearance Date*: Identifies the date when the defendant appeared in front of a judge for the first time to hear charges and learn about legal rights (terminology varies by jurisdiction including: initial appearance, preliminary

hearing, and arraignment).

- *Deferral Order Date*: Identifies the date when a deferred prosecution agreement or pretrial diversion was ordered or signed by the parties (terminology varies by jurisdiction including: pretrial diversion, deferred judgment, and deferred adjudication). If more than one deferral order date is associated with the case, MFJ selects the earliest date.
- *Bail Hearing Date*: Identifies the date when the bail hearing took place. This variable applies only to bail hearings relating to the initial pretrial release decision and it excludes bail hearings that might have been scheduled later in the processing of a case to modify the conditions of bail or to revoke it.
- *Cash Bond Setting Date*: Identifies the date when cash bond was set. This variable applies only if cash bond was the initial pretrial release decision and it excludes cash bond settings that might have taken place later in the processing of the case due to violations of pretrial release conditions.
- *Cash Bond Posting Date*: Identifies the date when cash bond was posted. This variable applies only if cash bond was the initial pretrial release decision and it excludes cash bond postings that might have taken place later in the processing of the case due to violations of pretrial release conditions.
- *Release on Own Recognizance (ROR) Decision Date*: Identifies the date when the court decided to release the defendant on his or her own recognizance. This variable applies only if ROR was the initial pretrial release decision.
- *Bond Revocation Date*: Identifies the earliest date when the pretrial release bond was revoked.
- *Bond Modification Date*: Identifies the earliest date when the pretrial release bond was modified.
- *Plea Date*: Identifies the date when the defendant entered a final plea (i.e., not guilty, guilty, no contest). This variable excludes guilty pleas entered as a condition to be admitted into a pretrial diversion program and any post-conviction plea events related to violations of probation or other court conditions.
- *Case Disposition Date*: Identifies the date when the case was closed, excluding any post-conviction events (e.g., violations of probation, appeals). For cases where prosecution is declined, this variable represents the date when the prosecutor decided to decline the case. For cases with deferred prosecution or pretrial diversion, this variable represents the date when deferral or diversion was ordered. For prosecuted cases, this variable represents the date when the case was disposed of. If more than one date was associated with the case, MFJ selects the last date before any post-conviction proceedings.
- *Indigence Determination Date*: Identifies the date when the defendant was determined by the court to be indigent. If the defendant was not determined to be indigent, MFJ leaves this blank.
- *Sentence Date*: Identifies the date when a sentence was imposed. If more than one sentence date is associated with the case, MFJ selects the earliest date. This variable excludes re-sentencing events that took place due to a violation of probation or other court conditions.
- *Prison Admission Date*: Identifies the date when a defendant was admitted to prison. If the defendant was not admitted to prison, MFJ leaves this blank. If there are multiple dates associated with the case, MFJ uses the initial date.

- *Parole Board Hearing Date*: Identifies the date when a parole board hearing was held. If there was no parole board hearing, MFJ leaves this blank. If there are multiple dates associated with the case, MFJ uses the initial date.
- *Prison Release Date*: Identifies the date when a defendant was released from prison. If the defendant was not released from prison, MFJ leaves this blank. If there are multiple dates associated with the case, MFJ uses the initial date.
- *Probation Admission Date*: Identifies the date when a defendant was admitted to probation. If the defendant was not admitted to probation, MFJ leaves this blank. If there are multiple dates associated with the case, MFJ uses the initial date.
- *Probation Release Date*: Identifies the date when a defendant was released from probation. If the defendant was not released from probation, MFJ leaves this blank. If there are multiple dates associated with the case, MFJ uses the initial date.
- *Censored Date*: Represents the date when the data were extracted from the case management system or the date the data were delivered to MFJ, if the former is not known.
- *Case Year*: Represents the year when the case was filed in court. For cases where prosecution was declined, this variable represents the year when the referral was made.
- *Disposition Year*: Represents the year when the case was closed or disposed of. For cases where prosecution was declined, this represents the year when the prosecutor decided to decline the case. For cases with deferred prosecution or pretrial diversion, this variable represents the year when the deferral or diversion was ordered. For prosecuted cases, this variable represents the final judgment year.
- *Indigence Determination Year*: Represents the year when the defendant was determined by the court to be indigent. For cases handled by public defenders, this often indicates when the case was assigned to their office.
- *Booking Year*: Represents the year when the booking associated with the case was conducted.
- *Sentence Year*: For cases resulting in a conviction, this variable represents the year when the sentence was imposed. We limit all sentencing data to events that took place after conviction but before post-conviction activity, such as appeals, violations of probation, or violations of other court orders.
- *Bond Motion*: Indicates whether a bond motion was ever filed in the current case. A bond motion is a formal request that the court reconsider the type or the conditions of pretrial release it originally set.
- *Discovery Order*: Indicates whether a discovery order was ever issued in the current case. A discovery order is a formal mandate from the court that the prosecution release any exculpatory evidence to the defense.
- *Speedy Trial Motion*: Indicates whether a speedy trial motion was ever filed in the case.
- *Speedy Trial Waiver*: Indicates whether the defendant's right to a speedy trial was waived in the case.
- *Continuance*: Indicates whether a continuance ever occurred during the case.
- *Total Continuances*: Indicates the number of continuances that occurred throughout the case.

- *Pretrial Sentence Investigation*: Indicates whether a pretrial sentencing investigation was conducted for the case.

3.3.9. CASE PROCESSING

- *Case Referral Initial Action*: Identifies the action that initiated the case referral, including arrest, noncustodial referrals (i.e., appearance tickets, citations, summonses), and other actions (includes sworn complaints).
- *Prosecuted*: Indicates whether the charges referred by law enforcement or a complainant to the prosecutor's office were declined for prosecution or filed in court. A case is coded as "declined" when none of the charges was filed in court, and as "prosecuted" when at least one charge was filed in court and the case did not result in transfer, change of venue, or extradition.
- *No Prosecutorial Review*: Indicates whether there was no prosecutorial review in the case, such as when the case is filed in court directly by law enforcement.
- *Case Status*: Indicates whether the case was not prosecuted (this should match with "case declined by the prosecutor" in the Prosecuted variable), was closed by the time data were extracted from the court's case management system (this should match with the following categories in the Case Disposition variable: dismissed, deferral or diversion, not guilty at trial, guilty at trial, guilty plea, guilty - unknown method, or other), or was open or had no disposition recorded in the data by the time of extraction (this should match with "no or unknown disposition" in the Case Disposition variable).
- *Days from Offense to Arrest*: Indicates the number of days between the offense date and the arrest date. Cases for which the time between offense and arrest exceed the time allowed by the state's statute of limitations are coded as missing because it is impossible to know whether excessive time spans are true or due to typos in the recording of dates by the original data source.
- *Days from Offense to Case Filing*: Indicates the number of days between the offense date and the case filing date. Cases for which the time between offense and case filing in court exceeds the time allowed by the state's statute of limitations are coded as missing because it is impossible to know whether excessive time spans are true or due to typos in the recording of dates by the original data source.
- *Days from Offense to Disposition or Sentencing*: Indicates the number of days between the offense date and sentencing date (or disposition date, in the case of non-conviction or no sentence date).
- *Days from Arrest to Initial Appearance*: Indicates the number of days between the arrest date and the initial appearance date.
- *Days from Case Filing to Initial Appearance*: Indicates the number of days between the case filing date and the initial appearance date.
- *Days from Case Filing to Attorney Assignment*: Indicates the number of days between the case filing date and the attorney assignment date.
- *Days from Attorney Assignment to Guilty Plea*: Indicates the number of days between the attorney assignment date and the date when the defendant entered a guilty plea.

- *Days from Filing to Case Closure*: Indicates the number of days between the case filing date and the case disposition date.
- *Felony Disposed of Within One Year*: Indicates whether a felony case was disposed of within 365 days.
- *Misdemeanor Disposed of Within Six Months*: Indicates whether a misdemeanor case was disposed of within 180 days.
- *Continuance*: Indicates whether a pending court action, such as a hearing or trial, was ever postponed (continued or adjourned) to a later date.
- *Total Number of Continuances*: Indicates the total number of times a pending court action was postponed (continued or adjourned) to a later date.
- *Court Fees*: Indicates whether the defendant was ordered to pay fees or costs to the court for the processing of their case. If the court fees were waived, we code the case as not having been ordered to pay fees.
- *Interpreter Requested*: Indicates whether an interpreter was requested in the case.
- *Interpreter Ordered*: Indicates whether an interpreter was ordered in the case.
- *Civil Forfeiture*: Indicates whether the case involved civil forfeiture of the defendant's property.

3.3.10. CASE DISPOSITION

- *Case Disposition*: Indicates the type of case resolution reached at the end of the case, excluding any dispositions stemming from appeals or violations of probation. Case disposition categories are defined as follows:
 - PROSECUTION DECLINED: All charges were declined for prosecution.
 - NO OR UNKNOWN DISPOSITION: The case was still open at the time of data extraction or, if it had already been closed, no disposition was recorded in the raw data.
 - DISMISSED: All charges were dismissed or withdrawn.
 - DEFERRAL OR DIVERSION: The defendant entered a pretrial diversion or deferred prosecution program.
 - NOT GUILTY AT TRIAL: The defendant was found not guilty of all charges in a jury or bench trial.
 - GUILTY AT TRIAL: The defendant was found guilty of at least one charge in a jury or bench trial.
 - GUILTY PLEA: The defendant pleaded guilty to at least one charge.
 - GUILTY - UNKNOWN METHOD: The defendant was guilty of at least one charge but the raw data do not indicate by which method (i.e., trial or plea).
 - TRANSFER: Includes dispositions such as transfers, changes of venue, and extraditions.
 - OTHER: Includes other dispositions such as bond estreature, bond forfeiture, and otherwise disposed.

- *Pretrial Diversion*: Indicates whether the defendant was admitted into a pretrial diversion or deferred prosecution program. This is considered a disposition that closes the case.
- *Pretrial Diversion Completion*: Indicates whether defendants who were admitted into a pretrial diversion or deferred prosecution program successfully completed it. This is considered a post-disposition event.
- *Specialized Court*: Indicates whether the case was diverted to a specialized court, including mental health, drug, DUI, and veterans courts.
- *Specialized Court Success*: Indicates whether a case that was diverted to and successfully completed a program in a specialized court, including mental health, drug, DUI, and veterans courts.
- *Community Prosecution*: Indicates whether the case was processed through community prosecution.
- *Restorative Justice*: Indicates whether the processing of the case included restorative justice.
- *DNA Test*: Indicates whether the case involved a DNA test.
- *DNA Evidence*: Indicates whether the case involved DNA evidence.
- *Trial*: Indicates whether the case was disposed of at trial regardless of whether it was a jury or bench trial. This should match with the “not guilty at trial” and “guilty at trial” categories in Case Disposition.
- *Final Plea*: Represents the defendant’s final plea (not guilty, guilty, no contest). Guilty pleas entered as a condition to admission into a deferred prosecution or pretrial diversion program are coded separately from guilty/no contest pleas.
- *Guilty Plea Without Attorney*: Indicates whether the defendant entered a guilty plea without retained or assigned counsel.
- *Felony Plead Down to Misdemeanor*: Indicates whether a top charge filed as a felony was reduced to a misdemeanor as a result of a guilty plea.
- *Guilty of All Charges*: Indicates whether the defendant was found guilty of (or pleaded guilty to) all charges filed in court by the prosecutor.
- *Conviction*: Indicates whether the defendant was convicted, regardless of the method of conviction.
- *Failure to Register as a Sex Offender*: Indicates whether the case included a conviction charge of failing to register as a sex offender, even if that was not the most serious charge in the case.
- *Dismissed by Prosecutor*: Indicates whether a case dismissal was initiated by the prosecutor. This includes withdrawn, dropped, or nolle prosequi cases.
- *Dismissed by Court*: Indicates whether a case dismissal was initiated by the court.
- *Dismissal Reason*: Identifies and categorizes the reason for case dismissal into eight different categories: for want of prosecution, in the interest of justice, speedy trial, dismissed with prejudice, dismissed without prejudice, mistrial, official misconduct, other (including mental incompetence, death of defendant, and other extraordinary means).

- *Declined in the Interest of Justice*: Identifies whether any charge in the case was declined in the interest of justice.
- *Dismissed in the Interest of Justice*: Identifies whether any charge in the case was dismissed in the interest of justice.
- *Deportation*: Indicates whether the defendant in the case was released into U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) custody for deportation proceedings.
- *Not Guilty by Reason of Insanity*: Indicates whether the defendant was found not guilty by reason of insanity.
- *Incompetent to Stand Trial*: Indicates whether the defendant was found incompetent to stand trial.
- *Habitual Offender*: Indicates whether the defendant was classified as a habitual offender.

3.3.11. SENTENCE

- *Top Sentence*: Identifies the most serious sentence imposed by the court. We define “most serious” as the sentence type that is the most restrictive of personal liberties among those imposed by the court on the convicted defendant. Top Sentence categories are defined as follows:
 - DEATH PENALTY: the defendant was sentenced to the death penalty for at least one charge.
 - LIFE IN PRISON: the defendant was sentenced to life in prison for at least one charge.
 - PRISON: the defendant was sentenced to confinement in state prison for at least one charge.
 - JAIL: the defendant was sentenced to confinement in jail for at least one charge.
 - LIFETIME SUPERVISION: the defendant was sentenced to lifetime supervision for at least one charge.
 - SPLIT SENTENCE (PRISON): the defendant was sentenced to extended supervision or split sentence with confinement in prison for at least one charge.
 - SPLIT SENTENCE (JAIL): the defendant was sentenced to extended supervision or split sentence with confinement in jail for at least one charge.
 - SPLIT SENTENCE (UNKNOWN): the defendant was sentenced to extended supervision or split sentence for at least one charge but the raw data do not indicate the type of confinement.
 - PROBATION: the defendant was sentenced to probation for at least one charge.
 - FINES: the defendant was sentenced to pay fines, forfeiture, costs, or other fees for at least one charge.
 - RESTITUTION: the defendant was sentenced to pay restitution for at least one charge.
 - OTHER: the defendant received some other sentence (e.g., community service) for at least one charge.
 - TIME SERVED: the defendant received a time served sentence and was not given additional confinement time, supervision, or fines.

- *Incarceration*: Indicates whether the most serious sentence imposed by the court involves prison or jail time (including life in prison and split sentences).
- *Prison Sentence Length in Days*: Reflects the length (in days) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was prison. When the top sentence was a split sentence that included prison, this reflects the imposed length of confinement (in days). For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range. We code life in prison sentences as having a length of 365,000 days (100 years).
- *Prison Sentence Length in Months*: Reflects the length (in months) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was prison. When the top sentence was a split sentence that included prison, this reflects the imposed length of confinement (in months). For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range. We code life in prison sentences as having a length of 1,200 months (100 years).
- *Jail Sentence Length in Days*: Reflects the length (in days) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was jail. When the top sentence was a split sentence that included jail, this reflects the imposed length of confinement (in days). For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range.
- *Jail Sentence Length in Months*: Reflects the length (in months) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was jail. When the top sentence was a split sentence that included jail, this reflects the imposed length of confinement (in months). For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range.
- *Probation Sentence Length in Days*: Reflects the length (in days) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was probation. When the top sentence was a split sentence, this reflects the imposed length of probation (in days). For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range.
- *Probation Sentence Length in Months*: Reflects the length (in months) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was probation. When the top sentence was a split sentence, this reflects the imposed length of probation (in months). For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range.
- *Split Sentence Length in Days*: Reflects the total length (in days) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was split between confinement and probation. For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range.
- *Split Sentence Length in Months*: Reflects the total length (in months) of the imposed sentence when the top sentence was split between confinement and probation. For indeterminate sentence lengths, we use the minimum length in the range.
- *Time Served Credit*: Indicates whether the convicted defendant received credit toward his/her sentence for the time spent in pretrial detention.
- *Time Served Credit (in Days)*: Reflects the number of days the convicted defendant spent in pretrial detention that were credited toward his/her sentence.
- *Time Served Sentence*: Indicates whether the convicted defendant received a time served sentence. In other words, it indicates whether the judge determined that the defendant did not need to pay any additional sentence time because s/he already spent an amount of time in pretrial detention that was equal to or exceeded the amount of time s/he would have been sentenced to spend in jail or prison after conviction.

- *Fine Amount:* If the most serious sentence was a fine, this reflects the fine amount the court ordered the convicted defendant to pay. Some jurisdictions combine fees and fines in the same field, likely causing the estimate of fines to be inflated.
- *Any Fine Amount:* Reflects the fine amount the court ordered the convicted defendant to pay, even when fine was not the most serious sentence.
- *Court Fees Amount:* Represents the final amount the court ordered the defendant to pay in fees or costs for the processing of their case. If the court fees were reduced, this reflects the reduced amount. Some jurisdictions combine fees and fines in the same field, likely causing the estimate of court fees to be inflated.
- *Court Fees Reduced:* Indicates whether the court ordered a reduction in the total amount of fees or costs the defendant was originally mandated to pay for the processing of his/her case.
- *Court Fees Waived:* Indicates whether the court waived the total amount of fees or costs the defendant was originally mandated to pay for the processing of his/her case.
- *Court Fees and Fines:* Indicates whether the court ordered the defendant to pay fees or fines.
- *Court Fees and Fines Amount:* Reflects the sum amount of fees and fines the defendant was ordered to pay.
- *Failure to Pay Court Fees and Fines:* Indicates whether the defendant failed to pay any amount owed in court fees and fines. This variable excludes cases closed in the three months prior to data extraction to account for payment plans offered by the court that could take a few months to enter into effect.
- *Driver's License Suspension or Revocation:* Indicates whether the sentence imposed by the court included the suspension or revocation of the convicted defendant's driver's license, including provisions such as "ordered not to drive."
- *Length of Driver's License Suspension:* Reflects the length (in months) the convicted defendant's driver's license was suspended by order of the court.
- *Probation Hold:* Indicates whether the defendant was in pretrial detention as the result of a probation violation.
- *Jail Stay Type:* Identifies the type of jail admission under which the defendant was booked into jail in 9 categories: pretrial detention, sentence, hold for another county, hold for department of corrections, hold for another state agency, hold for federal government (except ICE), hold for ICE, hold for unknown jurisdiction, probation hold.
- *Concurrent Sentence:* Indicates whether at least two sentences in the case were served concurrently.
- *Consecutive Sentence:* Indicates whether at least two sentences in the case were served consecutively.
- *Suspended Sentence:* Indicates whether at least a portion of a sentence imposed in the case was suspended.
- *Total Number of Life Sentences:* Identifies the number of life sentences imposed in the case.
- *Prison Stay Type:* Identifies the primary type of prison custody term served in 4 categories: hold, violation, transfer, commitment.

- *First Prison Commitment*: Indicates whether the associated prison commitment was the first commitment for the defendant.
- *Prison Sentence Served Days*: Identifies the amount of time in days for the time served in prison.
- *Prison Sentence Served Months*: Identifies the amount of time in months for the time served in prison.
- *Jail Sentence Served Days*: Identifies the amount of time in days for the time served in jail.
- *Jail Sentence Served Months*: Identifies the amount of time in months for the time served in jail.
- *Probation Sentence Served Days*: Identifies the amount of time in days for the time served on probation.
- *Probation Sentence Served Months*: Identifies the amount of time in months for the time served on probation.
- *Post-incarceration Supervision Type*: Identifies the initial type of post-incarceration supervision associated with the case in 7 categories: none, parole, split-sentence probation, electronic monitoring, drug/alcohol monitoring program, halfway house, other supervision. If multiple types were reported, MFJ selects the first type.
- *Total Parole Board Appearances*: Indicates the number of parole board hearings that were held before release.
- *Parole Served Days*: Identifies the amount of time in days for the time served on parole.
- *Parole Served Months*: Identifies the amount of time in months for the time served on parole.
- *Sentence Modification*: Identifies the type of modification made to the imposed sentence after sentencing in 5 categories: no modification, pardon, vacated, commuted, set aside.
- *Sentence Completed*: Indicates whether the defendant in the case completed the sentence.
- *Prison Death*: Indicates whether the defendant died in prison custody.
- *Prison Death Type*: Identifies the cause of death while in custody in 5 categories: homicide, medical/illness, accidental, natural causes, suicide/self-inflicted.
- *Prison Escape*: Indicates whether the defendant escaped from prison custody after the case was disposed.
- *Restitution*: Indicates whether the sentence included restitution.
- *Restitution Amount*: Identifies the amount of restitution (in dollars) associated with the case.
- *Restitution Paid*: Indicates whether the restitution associated with the case was paid.
- *Restitution Amount Paid to Victim*: Identifies the amount of restitution (in dollars) associated with the case that was paid to the victim.
- *Mental Health Confinement*: Indicates whether the sentence included mental health confinement.

3.3.12. POST-SENTENCING

- *Probation Violation*: Indicates whether there was a probation violation that occurred after the case was disposed.
- *Total Probation Violations*: Indicates the number of probation violations that occurred after the case was disposed.
- *Probation Violation Type*: Indicates whether the probation violation after the case was disposed was a technical violation or a new offense.
- *Probation Violation Time Served Months*: Indicates the amount of time in months for a probation violation after the case was disposed.
- *Probation Violation Time Served Days*: Indicates the amount of time in days for a probation violation after the case was disposed.
- *Probation Revoked*: Indicates whether probation after the case was disposed was revoked.
- *Total Parole Violations*: Indicates the number of parole violations that occurred after the case was disposed.
- *Parole Violation Type*: Indicates whether the parole violation after the case was disposed was a technical violation or a new offense.
- *Parole Violation Time Served Months*: Indicates the amount of time in months for a parole violation after the case was disposed.
- *Parole Violation Time Served Days*: Indicates the amount of time in days for a parole violation after the case was disposed.
- *Parole Revoked*: Indicates whether parole after the case was disposed was revoked.

3.4 Coding Cases as “Not Applicable”

We generally define a case as “Not Applicable” on any given field when the case did not have the opportunity to reach the phase or process captured by that data element. Some examples include:

- Cases that were declined for prosecution are coded as “Not Applicable” in all top filing and top conviction charge variables.
- Cases released on recognizance or nonmonetary conditions are coded as “Not Applicable” in all bail (or monetary conditions) fields.
- Cases resulting in a non-conviction (e.g., declinations, deferrals, dismissals, acquittals) are coded as “Not Applicable” in all top conviction charge and sentencing variables.
- Pending cases or those in which the disposition was missing are coded as “Not Applicable” in the time to disposition variables.

- Cases in which the most serious sentence is something other than a fine are coded as “Not Applicable” in Fine Amount.
- Cases that were not assessed court fees or had them waived are coded as “Not Applicable” in Failure to Pay Court Fees.

4. Data Quality Control

MFJ collects data from criminal justice administrative case management systems. Data can be entered into these systems incorrectly or not at all, and may be subject to errors at multiple stages of the sources' collection and recording process. We go to great lengths to ensure that the data we publish on our Portal are as accurate as possible and that our data management process does not add an extra source of error.

MFJ's data quality control process involves four general stages: (1) assessing the quality and completeness of raw data at intake; (2) conducting code review during the cleaning process; (3) conducting multiple internal audits of the cleaned case-level data; (4) conducting an external audit of county-level data; and (5) validating the county-level data with stakeholders.

4.1. Assessing Raw Data

Once data are delivered to MFJ, the Data Quality Analyst reviews the dataset to ensure that:

- It was provided in an electronic format that is machine readable. If data were delivered in PDF format, we assess whether the file contains computer readable text that can then be scraped¹⁶ and turned into a dataset by one of MFJ's senior developers. PDFs that cannot be scraped cannot be processed.
- It contains all essential data elements¹⁷, without which we cannot proceed.
- All field names and coding schemes are clear, and that a codebook or data dictionary was provided by the source¹⁸.
- All cases are within the time range requested.

Whenever issues are identified, MFJ contacts the source of the data and asks for clarification or a new data extraction with modifications. The dataset enters the data management queue once it passes this initial review process, which takes place in the secure server (Harp).

4.2. Internal Audits

All data management is conducted by research associates under the supervision of a senior member of the research team and with the support of a developer from the technology team. Once the first round of data management has concluded, the

¹⁶Data scraping is a technique in which a computer program is used to extract structured data (e.g., a table) from unstructured data (e.g., text in a document). When working with PDFs or scanned files, the developer writes a custom parser to map each character to a record and a field within the record using the character's position, its surrounding characters and, if available, formatting information. The output is a data table that can then be imported into a statistical software package.

Research Associate (RA) delivers the dataset to a senior member of the research team for auditing. The auditor thoroughly reviews the case-level data to ensure that the final dataset meets all the standard criteria described in the data management section, including aggregation to the case level ([see Section 3.2.](#)), proper creation of variables ([see Section 3.3.](#)), and proper coding of “Not Applicables” ([see Section 3.4.](#)). The auditor generates an audit report defining the issues¹⁹ the Research Associate needs to address and supervise the RA while he/she fixes the problems. A second auditor follows the same process, examining the data at the county level. This process is repeated as many times as necessary until no apparent issues are identified in the case-level data. A final internal audit is then conducted before delivery.

Upon completion of the internal audit process, the supervising senior researcher delivers the dataset to the product team for implementation in the Data Portal. The data delivery takes place in two stages. First, the data are run through a computer program that checks for consistency between the dataset and the codebook, including data elements that should be available in a given jurisdiction and their ranges of codes. The second step involves calculating the Measures using a statistical software package ([see Section 5 below](#)) and providing a report with counts and summary statistics to the product team so that they can cross-reference with the Data Portal’s Measure calculation results and ensure they are accurate. Once the cross-checks are completed, the data are pushed to a private version of the Data Portal.

4.3. External Audits

Outside criminologists with vast experience conducting research in the areas of criminal justice we measure, and in the county or jurisdiction being measured, conduct a thorough audit of the county-level data. We provide external auditors with access to a private version of the Data Portal containing only the data they are to audit. The external auditor examines the data for face validity, focusing on patterns, outliers, and inconsistencies across Measures, filters, and counties. Their reports identify any issues, whether data or interface related, they may have encountered.

The external audit report is then passed on to the RA originally in charge of the data management and onto the Director of Product to address issues related to the Portal’s interface. The RA works in tandem with the supervising senior researcher who carried out the internal audit to fix any problems found by the external auditor. They add an “MFJ Action” to each issue in the report to document how problems were tackled. The report with “MFJ Actions” is then returned to the external auditor for final approval of the solutions devised by MFJ. If the solutions are satisfactory to the external auditor, the data are considered ready for public consumption and redelivered to the tech team following the process described in Section 4.2. If there are any remaining concerns, we continue working on them until we find a solution that is satisfactory.

4.4. Stakeholder Validation

The last step of the data quality control process is validating the county-level Measures with stakeholders including the data providers, and, where possible, from a sample of counties represented in the source data. Once we address any issues raised by the external audits, we provide judges, prosecutors, public defenders, sheriffs, court administrators, and sometimes local researchers (e.g., current and former members of Sentencing Commissions, faculty from local universities) with access to

the data from their state in the private Data Portal. These stakeholders review the data for face validity and confirm or reject patterns as they are observed in the Measures. MFJ researchers work with stakeholders to identify and address potential sources of error or additional context to help frame the Measure for the jurisdiction, until they are satisfactorily solved, at which point the data are considered ready for public consumption. However, MFJ acknowledges that additional feedback will continue to trickle in as more people have access to the public data. We are committed to continue working on the Measures and the data to ensure the highest level of accuracy possible given the limitations of the raw data.

5. Measure Calculation

Measures are calculated according to their operational definitions ([see Section 5.1. below](#)). The research team writes the criteria for which cases are to be included in the calculation of the Measure (i.e., in the numerator and denominator of percentage measures, or the frequency distribution from which summary statistics should be drawn for median measures) and the tech team turns them into algorithms to produce the county-level Measures from the case-level data. Procedures are in place ([see Section 4.2.](#)) to ensure that the algorithm captures all criteria and produces an accurate result.

Although the specific criteria vary by Measure ([see Section 5.1. below](#)), all calculations exclude cases coded as “Not Applicable” and cases with missing values in the variables needed to create the Measure. Case type exclusions are reported in the informational section of all Measures in the Data Portal. In addition, data tables show the percentage of cases with missing data in the “anchor” variable and the percentage of cases with missing data on any of the factors needed for inclusion in the Measure. For example, the Measure “Nonviolent Misdemeanors with Nonmonetary Release (ROR)” excludes cases declined for prosecution; open cases or cases with unknown disposition at the time of data extraction; cases transferred to another jurisdiction; cases filed in the first three years of the study period; felonies; violent misdemeanors; and cases involving defendants with convictions in the prior three years. The “anchor” variable is Pretrial Release Decision, therefore, the Measure also excludes any cases for which the pretrial decision was missing. Furthermore, for a case to be included in the calculation of the Measure, we need to know the offense type – to ensure that only cases that had exclusively nonviolent charges are included – and the offense severity – to ensure that only cases that had exclusively misdemeanor charges are included – for all charges. Consequently, cases that are missing offense type or offense severity are excluded from the measure calculation.

All Measures are calculated at the county-level – because charging, disposition, and sentencing decisions take place at this level – and estimated using multiple years of data (five years for most Measures, and two years for those that require controlling for prior or future convictions) to increase the number of cases included in the analysis. This is particularly important for smaller jurisdictions that may have few criminal cases on an annual basis and would thus be excluded from the more fine-grained measurement due to small sample sizes (see below).

Moreover, because small samples can produce misleading estimates of percentages²⁰ and medians²¹, we include a jurisdiction in any given Measure only when there were at least 30 cases²² from which to draw.

In addition, suggestions to explore the current Measure with another related Measure (e.g., we recommend users explore “Cases Not Prosecuted” together with “Cases Dismissed”), and companion Measures that offer supplementary information (e.g., “Felony Cases Disposed of within 180 Days” is accompanied by “Median Time to Disposition for Felonies”) are provided as well.

Finally, users are able to compare the results on a single Measure for a given county across multiple data cohorts (i.e., cohort 1: 2009-2013; cohort 2: 2011-2015; cohort 3: 2013-2017; cohort 4: 2015-2019) and see how patterns may have changed over time.

5.1. The Measures

This section provides a short definition and operationalization for each Measure. Our Data Portal offers more in-depth definitions and context.

5.2. Filters

MFJ’s Data Portal offers the option to explore most Measures¹²¹ by defendant, victim, and case characteristics, including race/ethnicity, indigent status, sex, age group, state-specific offense severity, standardized offense severity, offense type, attorney type, court type where the case was disposed of (only for jurisdictions with two-tiered court systems), whether the case involved domestic abuse, and drug type. These filters are factors identified in the criminological literature as being associated with case processing and disposition outcomes.

5.3. Disparities

One of the most powerful features of the Portal is the ability it gives users to explore Measures by racial disparity, indigent status disparity, and sex disparity, all of which have been shown by research to occur throughout the charging, pretrial release, case disposition, and sentencing decision-making process.

We calculate disparities as the relative ratio of outcomes for two groups. It is important to note that we do not calculate disparities by looking at the disproportionate representation of one group in the criminal justice system compared to their representation in the general population (e.g., the percentage of defendants of color in the system compared to the percentage of people of color in the general population). The disproportionality approach requires controlling for risk because not everybody in, for instance, communities of color has the same probability of contact with the criminal justice system. We prefer to estimate disparities once the individual has already entered the criminal justice system because this allows us to focus on the equal (or disparate) treatment of defendants of different backgrounds by the system.

The relative disparity rate, also known as Relative Rate Index or RRI, compares the treatment of two groups (i.e., whites defendants and defendants of color; indigent and non-indigent defendants; males and females) by dividing the highest within-group score by the score of the other group. For example, in County A, 6% of white defendants were diverted pretrial compared to 1% of defendants of color. In this case, we divide the diversion rate for whites (the highest score) by the diversion rate for defendants of color. The result shows that, in County A, white defendants were diverted pretrial more often than defendants of

color by a ratio of 6 to 1. By contrast, in County B, the diversion rate was 2% for whites and 3% for defendants of color. Here we divide the diversion rate for defendants of color by the rate for white defendants, showing that, in County B, defendants of color were diverted pretrial more often than white defendants by a ratio of 1.5 to 1. Thus the relative disparity rate allows us to present information on how often defendants belonging to a group may have been affected (positively or negatively) by a criminal justice practice compared to defendants from the other group. A relative disparity equals to 1 indicates that there is no disparity in outcomes between the two groups.

Disparities are not calculated when there are fewer than four cases in the denominator of the rate for either group to avoid inflated standard errors. We also test and note the statistical and substantive significance of disparities. Disparities that are neither statistically nor substantively significant are suppressed from publication.

5.3.1. STATISTICAL SIGNIFICANCE

We estimate confidence intervals to test whether the disparity in outcomes for the two groups is beyond what could be expected by random chance. In this sense, statistical significance provides information about the precision and certainty of the measurement. Statistically significant disparities are noted with an asterisk (*).

We compute two types of confidence intervals, one for percentage disparities and one for median disparities, using the Price-Bonnett (2002) calculation.¹²² For percentage disparity calculations, we calculate the standard error (SE) of the disparity, where A and B represent the numerators for Groups 1 and 2, and C and D represent the denominators.

$$SE = \sqrt{\frac{1}{A} + \frac{1}{B} - \frac{1}{C} - \frac{1}{D}}$$

We then compute the natural log of the lower limit (LL) and upper limit (UL) of the disparities using the standard error, and exponentiate the log limits to get the correct confidence interval.

Confidence intervals for disparities in median measures requires the creation of a subset of case files used to calculate the measure, and a recording of the number of case files for the group (n_j) and the median for the group (m_j). Using these values, the following steps are applied:

Using these results, we compute the variance estimates for the natural log of each group median, denoted $\text{Var}(M_j^*)$, find the standard error (SE), and compute the confidence interval upper and lower limits.

In both percentage and median disparities, the confidence interval size is the ratio of the UL to LL, and determines whether or not the disparity estimates are sufficiently accurate to publish. If the size of the confidence interval is larger than 5, values are suppressed.

5.3.2. SUBSTANTIVE SIGNIFICANCE

Because statistical significance is affected by sample size (i.e., inferential tests are more likely to result in statistical significance with very large samples), we also evaluate whether the size of the disparity itself merits attention irrespective of statistical significance. Disparities equal to or greater than 1.05 (the equivalent of one group having 5 percent higher probability of getting the outcome as the other group) are considered substantively significant and attempts should be made to understand and address them.

5.3.3. PRECISION IN THE ESTIMATION OF DISPARITIES

The precision of the relative disparity rate depends largely on whether the source properly recorded the information necessary to determine whether a defendant belongs to a particular group. This issue is especially thorny when estimating racial disparities. Indeed, there is no consistent way in which criminal justice agencies collect race and ethnicity information. Some agencies may ask defendants to self-report the racial and ethnic group to which they belong. This method yields the most precise group assignment. However, many other agencies rely on the perception of the arresting or intake officer to assign a racial or ethnic group to a defendant. This method is likely to produce biased group assignments. Furthermore, even when they collect data on the race of the defendant, many agencies do not collect ethnicity information. As a result, Hispanics or Latinos are likely categorized as white or African American, which reduces the precision of our racial disparity estimates.

Additionally, small sample sizes in the numerators and denominators involved in the calculation of disparities may also affect the precision of the estimate. Indeed, sample sizes of fewer than four cases in the numerator or denominator of either of the two groups being compared will yield high standard errors (i.e., standard errors greater than half the size of the disparity score). To avoid presenting estimates with inflated standard errors, we suppress disparity rates for any jurisdiction where the number of cases is below four in the numerator or denominator of either group.

5.4. Outliers

We use a standard approach for calculating outliers. A county is flagged as an outlier when its value for a Measure or disparity estimate is a large distance from the values of all other counties in the state, and are classified into minor and major based

on the magnitude of this distance. The magnitude is calculated using the interquartile range (IQR), which is the difference between the 75th (Q3) and the 25th (Q1) percentiles.

5.4.1. MINOR OUTLIERS

Minor outliers are values that fall below Q1 or above Q3 by 1.5 times the IQR.

$$< Q1 - (1.5 \times IQR) \quad \text{or} \quad > Q3 + (1.5 \times IQR)$$

5.4.2. MAJOR OUTLIERS

Major outliers are values that fall below Q1 or above Q3 by 3 times the IQR.

$$< Q1 - (3 \times IQR) \quad \text{or} \quad > Q3 + (3 \times IQR)$$

5.5. Publication and Suppression Rules

We publish county-level results on a performance measure only when they conform to the following rules:

1. *State Averages*: The counties with available data must represent 50 percent or more of the state’s population for the state averages to be published.
2. *Number of Cases*: At least 30 cases are needed to generate any performance measure. Performance measures for counties with fewer than 30 cases in the denominator of percentage measures or in the pool to calculate median measures are suppressed from publication. Once measures have been filtered by groups (e.g., across race categories), the results are suppressed for groups containing fewer than five cases.
3. *Missingness*: The maximum permissible percentage of cases with missing values for any given measure is 10 percent. Performance measures for counties with more than 10 percent of cases missing values in the numerator of percentage measures or in the pool to calculate median measures are suppressed from publication. In addition, performance measures for counties with more than five percent and up to 10 percent of cases with missing values display a “high missing rate” warning.
4. *Missigness Bias*: We use statistical simulations to estimate the amount of bias that may result from missing data. The bias depends both on the percentage of missing data and the actual value of the measure being estimated. For example, in a county where the pretrial diversion rate is low (e.g., three percent) and there is a considerable proportion of cases missing data (e.g., seven percent), the estimate of the pretrial diversion rate could be inaccurate. Bias is estimated as a function of the Measure value (V) and the percentage of missing data (M).

$$\text{Relative Bias} = \exp(-3.749 + 16.165M - 55.265M^2 + 69.787M^3 - 9.872V + 18.409V^2 - 13.334V^3 + 0.370MV + 0.100M^2V - 0.518MV^2)$$

Whenever the measure value and the percentage of missing data suggest a level of bias greater than five percent, we suppress the data from publication.

5.5.1. PORTAL WARNINGS

The Portal will give the user a warning in the following circumstances:

1. *Missing > 5%*: Between 5% and 10% of cases are missing data in the “anchor” variable. The Measure will be calculated for the county and the data will be shown in all visualizations, and tables, but the user will be encouraged to use caution when interpreting the data under these conditions.
2. *Missing > 10%*: More than 10% of cases are missing data in the “anchor” variable. The Measure will not be calculated or visualized.
3. *Missingness Bias*: The estimate could be biased because the percentage of missing values is high relative to the measure score. The Measure will not be calculated or visualized.
4. *Insufficient Cases*: There were fewer than 30 cases in the pool from which the Measure was to be derived. This warning will also appear when there are fewer than four cases in the numerator or denominator of a disparity ratio. The Measure will not be calculated or visualized.
5. *Undefined*: The disparity could not be calculated because one of the group values was equal to zero.
6. *Estimated disparity is statistically and substantively significant*: This warning will appear when the disparity is statistically (the value will also be marked with an asterisk (*)) and substantively (disparity ≥ 1.05) significant.
7. *Estimated disparity is statistically but not substantively significant*: This warning will appear when the disparity is statistically (the value will also be marked with an asterisk (*)) but not substantively (disparity < 1.05) significant.
8. *Estimated disparity is not statistically significant but it is substantively significant*: This warning will appear when the disparity is substantively (disparity ≥ 1.05) but not statistically significant.
9. *Not significant*: This warning will appear when the estimated disparity is neither statistically nor substantively significant.
10. *No disparity*: This warning will appear when the relative ratio equals 1, indicating that there is no disparity in outcomes between the two groups.
11. *Data Not Available Yet*: Data collection or data management is still underway for the jurisdiction selected, data were not usable, or the corresponding agency within the jurisdiction selected declined to provide data.

5.6. Context

Besides allowing users to assess the performance of a county across a number of metrics, the goal of the Data Portal is to allow for county comparisons, as well, so that best practices can be identified and potentially replicated. In order to make valid comparisons, certain county characteristics must be taken into account. For instance, two urban counties with similar population sizes make for a better comparison than a large urban county being compared to a small rural jurisdiction. Moreover, since laws differ across states, and practices and policies vary across counties even within the same state, we provide the user with additional contextual data to guide interpretation and comparisons.

5.3.1. CONTEXTUAL MEASURES

We collect data from the Census Bureau, the FBI’s Uniform Crime Reports, and other sources to offer the user the ability to contextualize our criminal justice performance Measures according to population, crime, criminal justice resources, poverty, and other county characteristics.

Data from the US Decennial Census and the American Community Survey are downloaded from the Census Data API¹²³ using a Census Scraping Tool developed by MFJ. The table below lists all contextual measures available to the Data Portal user.

5.3.2. LEGAL CONTEXT

The Data Portal allows users to compare Measures across counties from different states. Because each state has its own criminal code and criminal procedure statutes, we collected data from state statutory laws for the study period, focusing on questions relating to pretrial release, indigent defense, sentencing, corrections, and collateral consequences. Questions related to clearing a criminal history include a flag if the laws have changed substantially, and provide current statute citations for user reference. The user will be able to look at the legal context that applies to each specific Measure for each state. When counties from two or more states are being compared, the Data Portal presents the information side by side so that the user can be more informed when interpreting the comparison. For instance, the user may be interested in comparing sentencing-related Measures for counties from two states. The Portal will inform the user that one state uses determinate sentencing policies while the other one uses indeterminate sentencing so that more accurate conclusions can be drawn from the comparison. Users can now also select legal context from multiple states at the same time, irrespective of whether they selected counties from those states to compare. This provides additional flexibility to users interested in comparing statutory law.

6. Measure Visualization

In addition to providing detailed tables with all of the information described in Section 5, MFJ’s Data Portal offers users the ability to visualize the data through heat maps and bar graphs, which allow the user to see the distribution of county values for the whole state at a glance.¹⁴⁸ Multiple counties can be selected at the same time to populate the statistical tables by clicking on the jurisdiction’s polygon in the map, on the county’s bar in the graph, or on “Find County” and then typing the county name or a zip code.

6.1. Data Views

The default view shows data for counties whose values are not suppressed. This view includes in the map, bar graph, and table only those counties that had at least 30 cases in the pool from which the Measure was derived and less than 20% of cases with missing data ([see Section 5](#)). The counties that don’t meet these criteria are excluded from the visualizations, and the Measure score is not calculated for them.

In addition, in the state view, the user has the option of switching to views that include “Counties with Data,” which shows all counties for which there are data available, even if there are more than 20% of cases with missing information or less than 30 cases in the pool (the Measure score is still not calculated for these counties but the number of cases included in the numerator and denominator that would have made the score are still presented in the table); “All Counties,” which shows all counties within the state even if they don’t have data; and “Selected Counties,” which shows only the counties the user pinned, so that potential noise from other counties can be muted and more precise comparisons can take place.

6.2. Heat Maps

On pages where heat maps are provided, Measures use quintiles to determine the color shade representing the range of values within a group. Counties with scores in the first quintile are depicted in the lightest shade and those with scores in the fifth quintile in the darkest shade. Counties where data are not available or where sample sizes are too small to produce an accurate estimate are colored grey.

Disparity heat maps use sextiles and differentiate the ranges by a green or blue shade depending on the direction of the disparity. When relative disparity scores are equal to one or absolute disparity scores are equal to 0%, meaning there is no disparity between the two groups being compared, the county is colored white.

6.3. Bar Graphs

Where bar graphs for unfiltered Measures are used, they depict each county’s value as a bar located in an X-Y plot. The height of the bar on the Y axis represents the county’s score. By default, counties are sorted with the lowest value on the left side and the highest value on the right side of the X axis.
